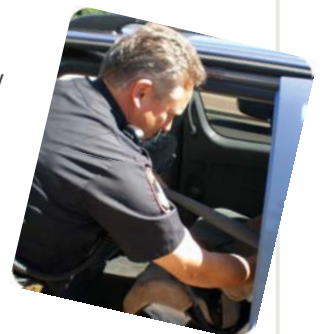

### Dean Foundation and Middleton Police Pilot "Stop and Seat" Program

Dean Foundation and the Middleton Police Department have teamed up to launch the "**Stop and Seat**" Program to help ensure that every child riding in a car is riding safe and abiding by Wisconsin's child passenger safety laws.

Previously, violators being pulled over who did not have their children properly restrained would receive a ticket and be allowed to drive off. The "Stop and Seat" program allows a Middleton Police officer to provide and install an appropriate "loaner" child passenger or booster seat. The offender is then given a warning ticket and allowed ten days to purchase a child passenger restraint or enroll in the **Every Ride a Safe Ride Program**. ### Allergies? (Study #497)

Many kids suffer from seasonal allergies without even knowing it since the symptoms look and feel a lot like a cold.

Dean Foundation is conducting a clinical research study of an investigational nasal spray medication for the treatment of seasonal allergies.

- Itchy, runny, or stuffy nose
